

Leaf Lantern

How to make a quick and easy Leaf Lantern for procession

Equipment

- Baking paper/ transparent paper
- Leaves
- Glue
- Cheese box like camembert or cardboard



Instructions


1. Press leaves between newspapers for a day or two (to allow them to dry off fully and flatten a little).
2. Cut two sheets of baking paper to fit around your cheese lids and at a height that you want. Lay one sheet flat and cover in glue.
3. Add your leaves – you will get a better glow if they do not overlap too much.
4. Add more glue and then press the second sheet of grease proof paper on top.
5. Take your cheese lids. Either staple or glue your paper to the inside of these lids.
6. Create two holes in the top lid and hang string so you can carry your lantern.
7. Place tealight in bottom taped in.

Milk Bottle Lantern

How to make a quick and Milk Bottle Lantern for procession

Equipment

- Milk Bottle
- Black sharpie pen or permanent marker



Instructions

1. Clean and dry your milk bottle.
2. Draw your design, try bats, trees, spider webs, fireworks.
3. Attach battery tealight upside down in top and tape in place or hang a glow stick inside.

Jam Jar Lantern

How to make a quick and Jam Jar Lantern for procession

Equipment

- Jam Jar or Jar with handle
- Paint, stickers jewels, tissue paper, glue.



Instructions

1. Clean and dry your jam jar. If you jar does not have a handle create one by twisting wire/string around the screw top of jar.
2. Get creative, use stickers, jewels, feathers, paint or tissue paper.
3. Attach battery tealight upside down in top and tape in place or hang a glow stick inside.
4. Place tealight in bottom taped in.
